Commissioner's Foreword



Presenting Police Crime Statistics Annual Report(s) is a tricky and cumbersome tasks for any police or law enforcement jurisdiction. Nonetheless, I take this opportunity to applaud my team of officers, as well as the numerous valued stakeholders, and partners, government, private and civil society agencies. It is through whom, the Fiji Police has continually made inroads to improving our Crime and indeed all, including traffic related statistics for publications. Fiji Police cherishes these significant contributions and partnerships in realizing our Upper Level Outcome "Safer Fiji For All". In light of this, presented before you is the Fiji Police Crime Statistics Annual Report 2017.

The major highlights of Crime Statistics for this Annual Report for the period covering January – December 2017 has been the: 3% decrease in serious crime, 14% decrease in crime against women, 12% decrease in crime against children and a 9% decrease in overall crime rate. These have been amongst the nine (9) major Key Performance Indicators (KPI's) of the Fiji Police Force. These decreases can be attributed to a multitude of factors, and Fiji Police takes notes of all parties involved in curbing crimes related to these categories.

Further, there has been dramatic changes in societal behaviors, both through advocacy and awareness, and willingness to report crime(s), even prolonged over yester-years to come forth and report occurrences of crime and delinquencies. This however, may give an upsurge in crime figures, but relatively, this demonstrates the confidence in police investigations, police relations, and availability of reporting avenues in other law enforcement and civil society agencies as well. Fiji Police acknowledges the judicial, corrections and other community based frameworks in the preventative, prosecutorial, justice, advocacy and awareness measures undertaken in our communities. The Fiji Police Community Policing 'DUAVATA' concept is committed on building trust, advocacy on these gender and domestic, serious, drugs and alcohol related crimes.

As the facts and figures to this Annual Report are prescribed in detail in later pages, there have been some significant steps undertaken by the Fiji Police to address crime and delinquent behaviors in our communities. Deducted from the United Nations is the Convention on Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women, the child factor is also attached as means to mainstream our collective efforts to gender and child based violence. Fiji Police along with its partner agencies is committed to addressing these ills for a better society for our vulnerable. Drugs, both green and synthetic, has become a menace to the society. Cultivation, manufacture, and trade is highly secretive. My officers have often come to severe confronting situations in frontlines, often putting their lives in danger, either on domestic violence or drugs operations. Domestic Violence, gender and child abuse, sexual violations, cyber and social media exploitations and other social ills are of highly secretive nature. Unless reported, they remain unaccounted for corrective actions.

There has been both investment and interventions in Fiji Police of late to improving systems and process, operational and administrative enablers to uplift service delivery. Measures of compliance such as the 'First Hour Interview', uplifting of standards in our holding (custody) cells, electronic interviewing (video recorded interview [VRI]) for more credibility and means to judicial compliance is being heavily invested upon. Fiji Police is also engaged in consultancy with Pacific Community in the second (II) Phase of the Geo-spatial/GIS capability in mapping, recording and analysis of crime. Herein, more structured approach to crime and operational planning is being administered. Fiji Government is also committed to acquiring Drone and CCTV capabilities for Fiji Police, as these will enable better techno based surveillance and control interventions for operational purposes (traffic control, drugs surveillance and raids, and crowd control), to name a few.

In concluding, I am strongly inclined to presenting this Annual Crime Statistics Report not merely as a document of reflection and reference, rather urging all stakeholders, both internal and external, for interventions in their many ways to addressing crime, and fear of crime, creation of a law abiding citizenry, reduce behavior and anger based criminal activities, reduction of avenues and opportunities for commission of crime and delinquent behaviors in our communities. A dignified intervention should be towards addressing drugs, gender based violence, crimes against children and vulnerable in our communities. Our citizens, households and business have become targets of many heinous violent robberies and invasions, as such our communities' needs interventions from all sectors as means to the ownership and reflections of our values of social well-being, Safety and Security for all citizens, visitors and investors to our beautiful country, we call Fiji.

As stated by the Commissioner of Police in his 'Foreword', the complexities of crime statistics analysis is indeed tricky and remains a challenge to many police jurisdictions. As reporting crime occurrences, arrest and subsequent prosecutions overlaps from year to year, capturing accurate data does have a wide ranging bearing on analysis and results. Thus, Annual Reports often reflect on captured data only, and not of occurrences unreported or those overlapping reporting periods. Yet another factor, peculiar to multiple counts occurrences, such as fraud cases, highly inflates crime figures in these statistical reports. It is also highly contentious on interpreting crimes as numbers or percentage(s) [%], as a mere rise or decrease of a single digit figure can show mammoth percentage rise or decrease of crime.

The Fiji Police Crime Statistics Unit, based at the Directorate of the Strategic Planning, Policy, Research & Development, at Police Headquarters remains the central data collation, analysis and dissemination centre for the Fiji Police statistical services. The unit relies heavily on its feeder units in Criminal Investigations Department (CID), Juvenile Bureau, Operations Headquarters (PCCC), stations and Community Posts.

Fiji Police has adopted a template to classify, and capture crime data based on categories ascribed in the Crimes Act, Minor Offences Act, and other relative pieces of legislation. The credibility of police data still remains on the integrity and accuracy of human inputs and analysis thereafter. The Statistics Units strives to maintain a high degree of automation and application of automated systems in the analysis, presentation for 'consumption' of crime statistics for our end-users.

1.1 Crime Statistics Collection

As stipulated in the Force Standing Orders [FSO], the Fiji Police Force Annual Statistics Report is derived under the following means:

- Receiving Reports in Police Stations [34], Community Posts [85], and other units or intra/inter-agencies which provide information and data; and
- Daily Crime Reports [DCR] - reports categorized as Crimes Registered (CR) at station level which is submitted daily from all 35 Police Stations in Fiji. These are daily occurrences of crime facts and figures that are fed from the stations to the 'divisional headquarters, and the Central Statistics Office at the Directorate of Planning, Police Headquarters.

1.2 Offences Classification

The data compiled in this document (Fiji Police Annual Report) is the crime data which are captured, translated and classified under the Crimes Act, 2009 (formerly Crimes Decree 2009). In this, there are 250 different offences which are classified under a cluster of five (5) major categories.

Appended below are the five (5) major categories of criminal offences:

1. Offences against the Administration of Lawful Authority (includes Treason and Other Offences against Government Authority; Other Offences against Public Order; Offences against the International Order)
2. Offences against Public Morality (includes Sexual Offences, Prostitution Offences, Abortion Offences)
3. Offences Against the Person (includes Common Assault)
4. Offences Against the Property (includes Theft, Robbery, Burglary and Fraudulent Conduct)
5. Other Miscellaneous Offences

It should be noted that there are other offences (e.g. money laundering) not classified under the Crimes Act, 2017, which are also criminal in nature and have breached other Acts such as the Financial Transaction Act, Copyright Act etc.

1.3 Reference Period

The Crime Statistics Report is prepared annually for the period from 1st January to 31st December per calendar year.

1.4 Definition of Crime

Crime is an offence, classified as an act or omission forbidden by law for which the state enacts penalty punishable by law.

1.5 Investigation

Is the search for the truth in the interest of justice and in accordance with the specifications of the Law.

1.6 Reported Offences

Reported offences are offences which are reported to the Police and appropriate entries are entered in the Complaints Register. These are the data that gets analyzed and reflected in briefs and reports such as the 'Fiji Police Annual Statistics Report'. Any other perceived information or incident occurring in the community that are underreported does not necessarily amount to a data.

1.7 Detected Offences

All offences/ crimes are deemed to be detected under the following circumstances:

- The offender has been arrested and/or produced before a court of law, or summoned and;
- The offender has been dealt with in accordance with the laws of the land, and authority vested to the Fiji Police Force such as cautioning juveniles.

1.8 Data Source

Fiji Police Force Crime Statistics are compiled from the data received at the office from the 35 Police Stations located within the four divisions namely: Southern, Western, Eastern and Northern division.

1.9 Monitoring & Evaluation [M & E]

Fiji Police Force has a variety of Monitoring and Evaluation [M & E] methods in its Criminal Data process framework. First and foremost, the measure of performance is tagged to the institutional Annual Corporate Plan [ACP] through the Key Performance Indicator(s) [KPI]. These data form the core benchmark indicators of performance and productivity. The KPIs drive performances in personnel all throughout the year. In addition, initiated from the Planning Office, these data sets are monitored on a monthly and quarterly basis through the process of verification. The result of achievements, shortfalls and improvement of gap areas are handed to the Commissioner of Police, who then discloses these results in his quarterly address to all members of the Fiji Police. The same is also made public through a media release. Furthermore, daily monitoring of performance based on data takes place on the bi-weekly Skype briefs from the four divisions. Finally, the Statistics Unit has also embarked on issuing weekly Bulletins in the 'Force Routine Order', a form of newsletter in the Fiji Police Force.

2.0 Disclaimer

There is no intent to discriminate, vilify or malign certain segments of our society's victim(s) and/or offender(s) of crime on ethnic, gender, age, geographical or other classification based distribution. The publisher acknowledges that these factors are sensitive in nature, however, for analysis and better demonstration of data relative to Fiji, such is portrayed in this Annual Report.

2.1 Percentage Change Formula

Please note the Percentage Change Formula:

$$\text{Percentage Change (\%)} = \frac{\text{Current Value minus Previous Value}}{\text{Previous Value}^*} \times 100$$

* If the previous value = 0, the answer will be **#DIV/0!** Error as its percentage. Thus, percentage change is not divisible by the number 0.

If the answer is a positive number then this is a percentage increase. If the answer is a negative number then this is a percentage decrease.

2.0 Classification of Crime Report & Interpretation

The cases in this report are stipulated in the Crimes Act (Decree No. 44 of 2009) and are investigated by the Criminal Investigation Department, (CID), Uniform Branch (UB) personnel, other Specialised Units and Task Forces. These data excludes those offences that are also criminal in nature but are investigated and prosecuted by other agencies such as FICAC, FRCS etc. In such cases, these crimes are not reported to police and does not form part of our data-set, and may not be the ideal reflection of the true extent of crimes in Fiji.

1. Crime Report (Cr)

These are reports and complaints that are classified as offences under any Section of the Law, and may contain strong elements of prima-facie (criminality based on enough evidence) to instigate investigation and prosecution.

2. No Case in Law (Ncil)

These reports and complaints are not classified as offence(s) under any Section of the Law. However, complainants are given credible advice and guidance to explore other causes of actions, like reconciliations, generating community cohesiveness, well-being, partnerships and harmony etc.

3. Civil Cases

These are complaints which are civil in nature and can only be pursued by the complainant through civil processes. The police have no legal jurisdiction to investigate such complaints. These include seeking own legal advice through solicitors, and other legal frameworks, such as the Small Claims Tribunal etc.

4. Trivial (Trivial IR)

These are complaints which are trivial in nature and do not necessitate any formal investigation. Initial action(s) on attending these complaints are however undertaken in order to secure safety, security and harmony between the parties involved.

5. Lost & Found Property (L&FP)

These are complaints in nature of Lost and Found property and are registered under the Lost and Found Register.

6. Accident Report (AR)

These are reports of road accidents which occur on public roads in Fiji. The figures under these category are captured under the Annual Traffic Statistics Report.

7. Traffic Booking Report (TOR)

These are traffic booking cases for traffic infringements and Drunk & Drive cases.

8. Uniform Branch Report (UB)

Offences under the Crimes Act and Minor Offences Act are often investigated by the Uniform Branch personnel, and prosecuted summarily per charge and/or summon process.

9. Police Enquiry Paper (PEP)

It is a docket (police enquiry paper [file]) prepared to determine whether a case is civil or criminal in nature after an investigation is conducted. As enough evidence (prima-facie) is ascertained, the file is then converted to full criminal investigation enquiry (CR).

10. Referral To Other Stations Or Agencies

These are reports that are referred to another police station for investigation since the offence was committed within that station or court boundary/jurisdiction respectively. In other cases, there may be a core government stakeholder who may have been the rightful agency to have attended to such complaints or calls to service(s). These may include: Health, Agriculture, Customs, Welfare, Municipalities, Roads Authority, Non- governmental agencies or other essential service providers etc.

Crime Highlights - Year 2017

During the year 2017, a total of 18,128 crime cases were recorded, and registered as active police investigation files. Comparatively, in 2016, 19,998 crime cases were recorded and registered. This demonstrates a 9% decrease in crime cases when compared to 2016. Translated into raw figures, this shows a decrease of 1,870 crime cases.

3.1 Detection

The year 2017 recorded a 69% detection rate compared to 66% in 2016. This is an increase of 3%. There are multiple factors contributing to the rise in these figures, such includes; improvement in police mobility, staff training, higher commitment to KPIs, to name a few.

3.2 Offence Category Distribution 2017

- I. Offences against The Property (Prop) recorded 51.02% of the Offences;
- II. Offences against The Person (Per) recorded 27.80%;
- III. Other Offences against Crimes Act (CA) recorded 13.20%;
- IV. Offences against Public Morality (PM) recorded 5.75%;
- V. Offences against Lawful Authority (LA) recorded 2.20% and,
- VI. Offences against Other Acts recorded 0.03% of the overall offences(s).

Serious Offences

Under the Fiji Police KPIs, there are nine offences which are categorised as 'Serious Offences'. These are: (1) Rape & Attempted Rape, (2) Defilement of children under 13 years of age, (3) Defilement of young persons between 13 to 16 years of age, (4) Murder, (5) Aggravated Robbery, (6) Burglary, (7) Arson & Setting fire to crops, (8) Theft of Motor Vehicle and (9) Drug offences.

1. Rape & Attempted Rape

Rape and Attempted Rape is an offence under the Offences against the Public Morality category. The year 2017 recorded 210 Rape & Attempted Rape cases whereas the year 2016 recorded 327 cases. Comparatively, this showed a decrease of 36% (117 cases).

2. Defilement of Children Under 13 years of age (DOCU 13)

Defilement of Children under 13 years of age is an offence under the Offences against the Public Morality category. The year 2017, recorded 5 cases whereas the year 2016 recorded 3 cases. This showed an increase of 67% (2 cases).

3. Defilement of young persons between 13 to 16 years of age (DOYPB 13-16)

Defilement of young persons between 13 to 16 years of age is an offence under the Offences against the Public Morality category. The year 2017, recorded 94 cases whereas the year 2016 recorded 127 cases. This showed a decrease of 26% (33 cases).

4. Murder

Murder is an offences under the Offences against the Person category. The year 2017, recorded 12 cases whereas the year 2016 recorded 15 cases. This is a decrease of 20% (3 cases).

5. Aggravated Robbery

Aggravated Robbery is an offence under the Offences against the Property category. The year 2017, recorded 501 aggravated robbery cases whereas the year 2016, recorded 440 cases. This showed an increase of 14% (61 cases).

6. Burglary

Burglary is an offence under the Offences against the Property category. The year 2017, recorded 2,180 burglary cases whereas the year 2016, recorded 2,337 cases. This showed a decrease of 7% (157 cases).

7. Arson & Setting Fire to Crops

Arson & Setting Fire to Crops is an offence under the Offences against the Property category. The year 2017, recorded 20 cases whereas the year 2016 recorded 30 cases. This is a decrease of 33% (10 cases).

8. Theft of Motor Vehicle

Theft of Motor Vehicle is an offence under the Offences against the Property category. The year 2017, recorded 76 cases whereas the year 2016 recorded 85 cases. This is a decrease of 11% (9 cases).

9. Drugs Offences

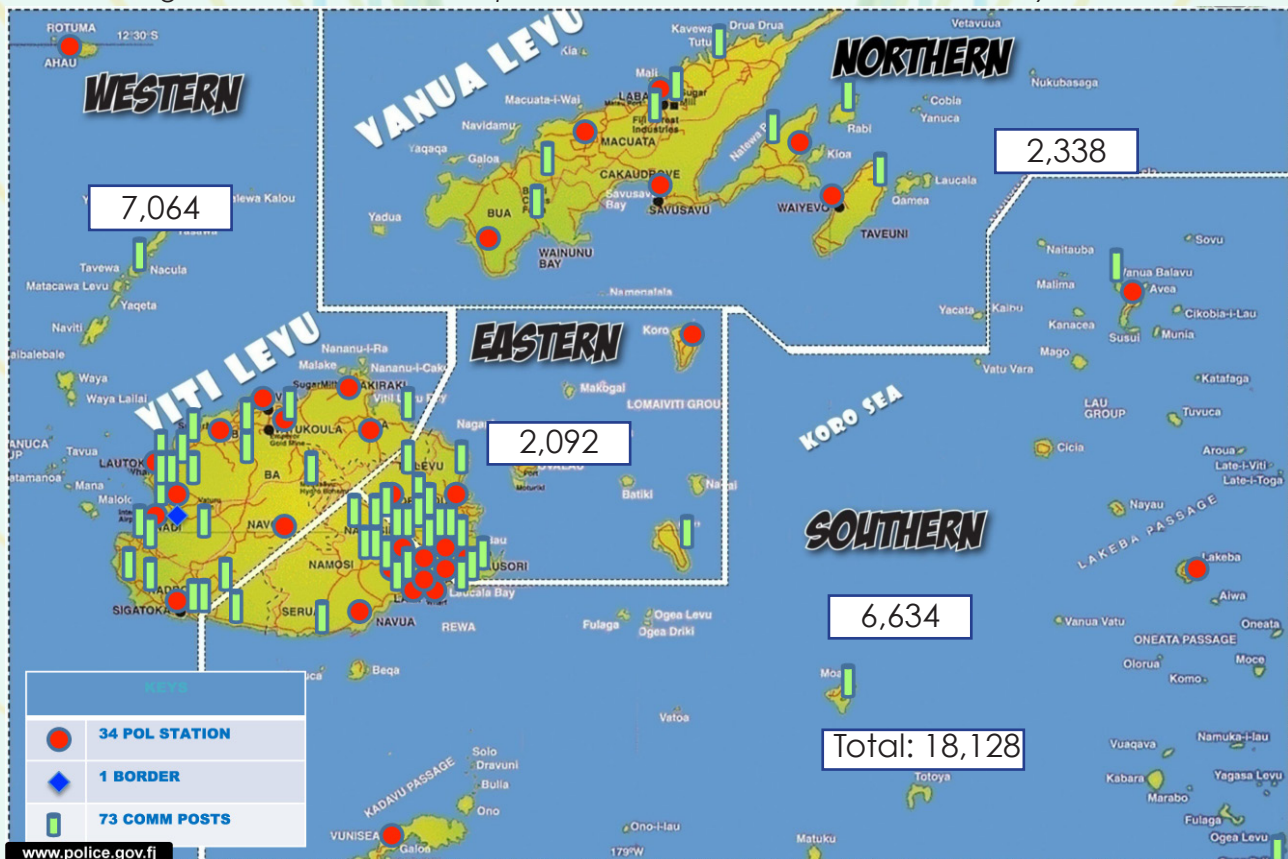
A drug offence is an offence under the Other Offences against the Crime Act. The year 2017 recorded 685 drug related cases whereas the year 2016 recorded 524 cases. This showed an increase of 31% (161 cases).

The above table displays the Offence Category distribution for the years 2016 and 2017. Comparative to all categories of offences, Offences against the Property continue to be the most prevalent of the offences committed in 2017.

Overall, there was a 9% decrease in the total number of crime cases recorded in 2017 when compared to the previous year. The Offences against Lawful Authority recorded an increase of 18% and Other Offences against Crime Act recorded an increase of 28% while the Offences against Public Morality recorded a decrease of 38%, Offences against the Person recorded a decrease of 6%, Offences against the Property recorded a decrease of 14% and Offences Against Other Acts recorded a decrease of 45% when compared to the same period in 2016.

Table 4.0: The detection rate for 2017 was 69% and it has increased by 3% when compared to 2016, which recorded 66%. The offences with a detection rate of over 90% are as follows: Corruption & Abuse of Office, Others against Lawful Authority, Rape & Attempted Rape, Defilement of children under 13 years of age, Defilement of young persons between 13-16 years of age, Incest, Sexual Assault, Attempted Murder, Manslaughter, Infanticide, Assault on Police, Fraud & False Pretense, Receiving Stolen Property, Forgery, Currency Offences, Others against Crime Act and Drugs cases. There were 69% of Detected Cases and 31% of Undetected Cases during the reference period 2017 and 66% of Detected Cases and 34% of Undetected Cases for the year 2016.

The detection rate remains a challenge for the other Police Stations as they have recorded below 70%. These Stations are: Samabula, Nabua, Raiwaqa, Valelevu, Navua, Kadavu, Vanuabalavu, Lautoka, Namaka, Korovou, Nakasi, Savusavu, Taveuni, Tukavesi, Labasa and Nabouwalu Police Stations.

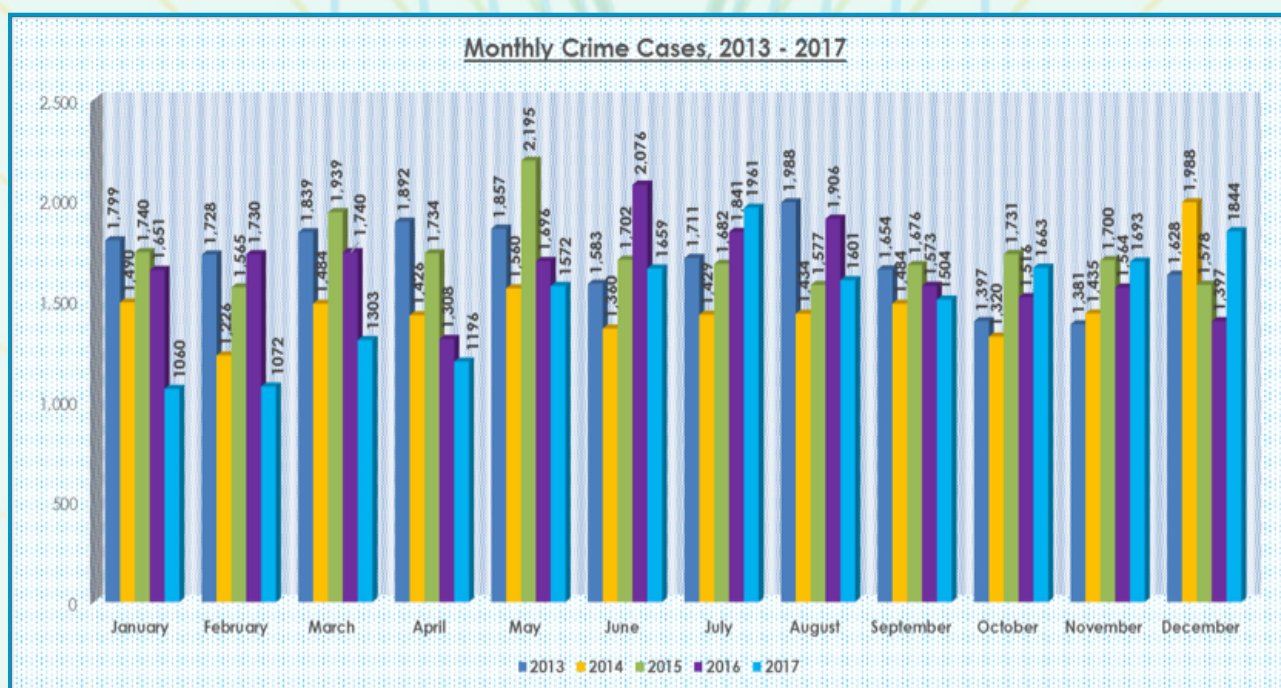

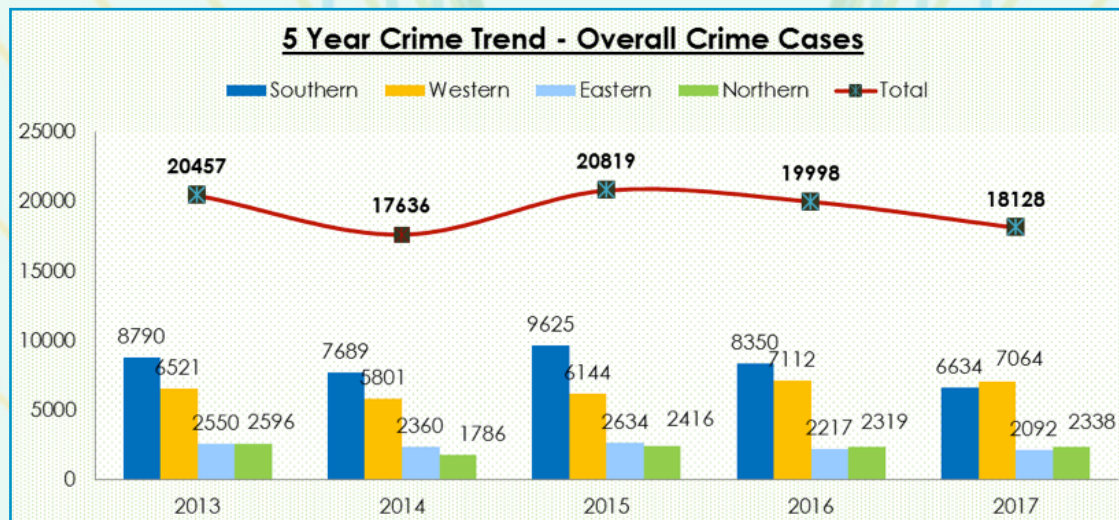
Table 7.0 shows the crime cases monthly comparison for the year 2017. The months that have recorded high crime cases in 2017 are July and December. Some prevalent offences that have recorded the highest in a particular month are mentioned as follows: Rape & Attempted rape (33 cases) in May, Defilement of young persons between 13-16 years of age (21 cases) in December, Sexual Assault (14 cases) in April, Murder (3 cases) in September and December, Assault causing actual bodily harm (359 cases) in November, Fraud & False Pretence (192 cases) in July, Aggravated robbery (62 cases) in September, Burglary (257 cases) in May, Theft (610 cases) in July and Drugs offence (119 cases) in November.

Divisional Crime Trend

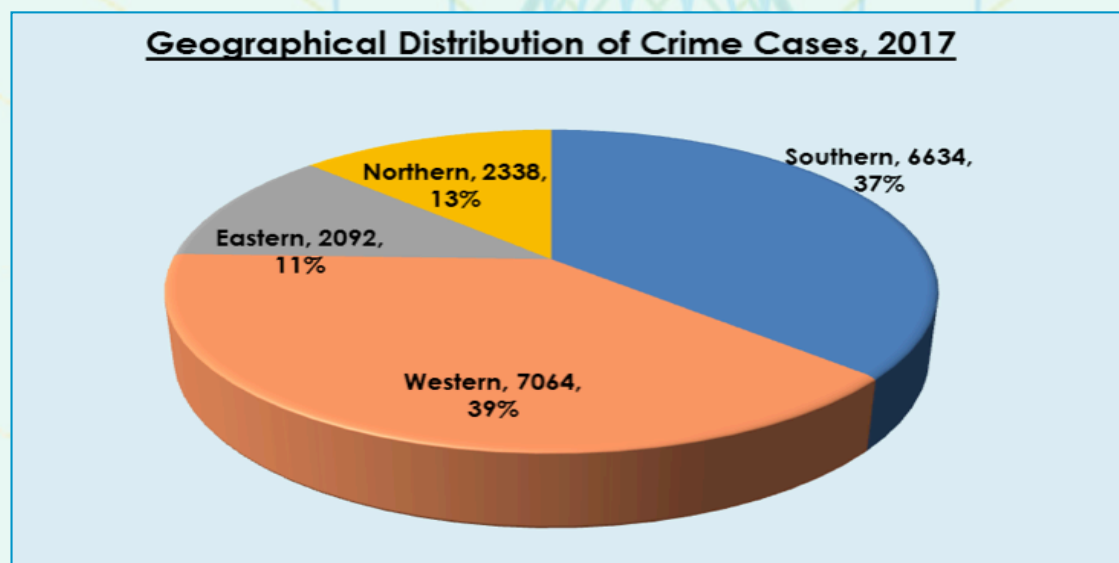
This section gives a detail examination of crime in Fiji's main divisions during the five-year period (2013-2017). The tabulations in this section contain information exclusively for each of the four (4) divisions. The Crime Statistics kept by the Fiji Police Crime Statistics Office is compiled under three hierarchies. First, statistics is compiled nationally, then compiled divisionally and the third category is compiled by stations.

6.1 Crime Cases Divisional Comparison - Five Year Trend



The Combination Chart 6.1 shows the Divisional Comparison of the Criminal Cases for the years 2013 to 2017. It is noticed that overall crime has a downward slope; indicating a decrease in crime. In the 2017, a total of 18,128 Crime cases were reported, while 2016 had 19,998 Crime cases; a decrease by 10% (a decrease by 1,870 crime cases). The Southern division recorded a decrease of 21%, the Western division decreased by 1%, Eastern decreased by 6% while the Northern increased by 1% in 2017 when compared to the same period in 2016.

6.2 Geographical Distribution of Crime Cases - 2017



The above pie chart shows the geographical distribution of crime cases for the year 2017. The Western Division recorded the highest with 7,064 cases (39%) followed by the Southern Division with 6,634 cases (37%), the Northern Division with 2,338 cases (13%) and Eastern Division with 2,092 cases (11%) from the overall 18,128 crime cases.

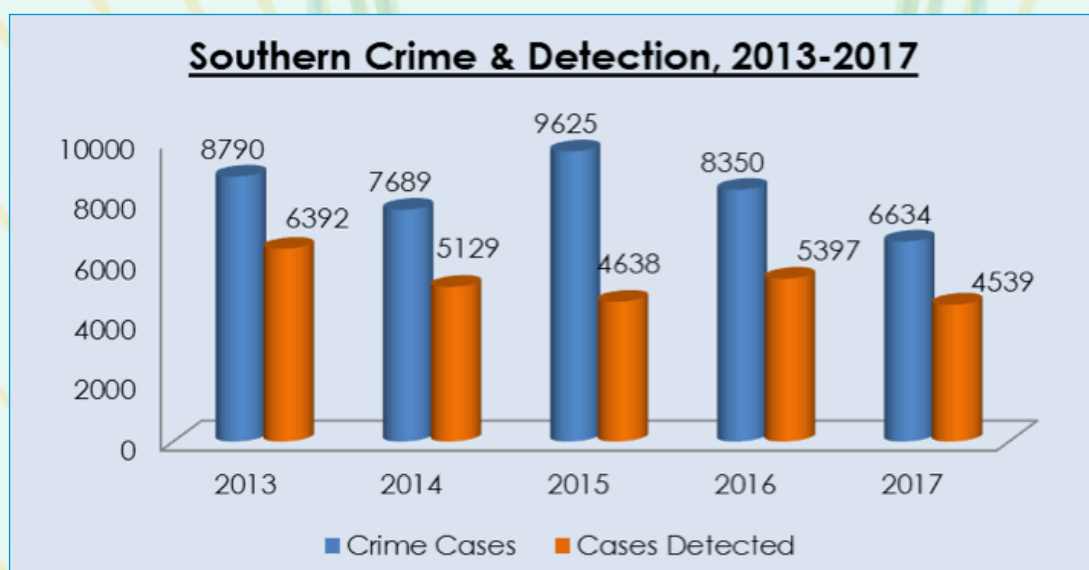

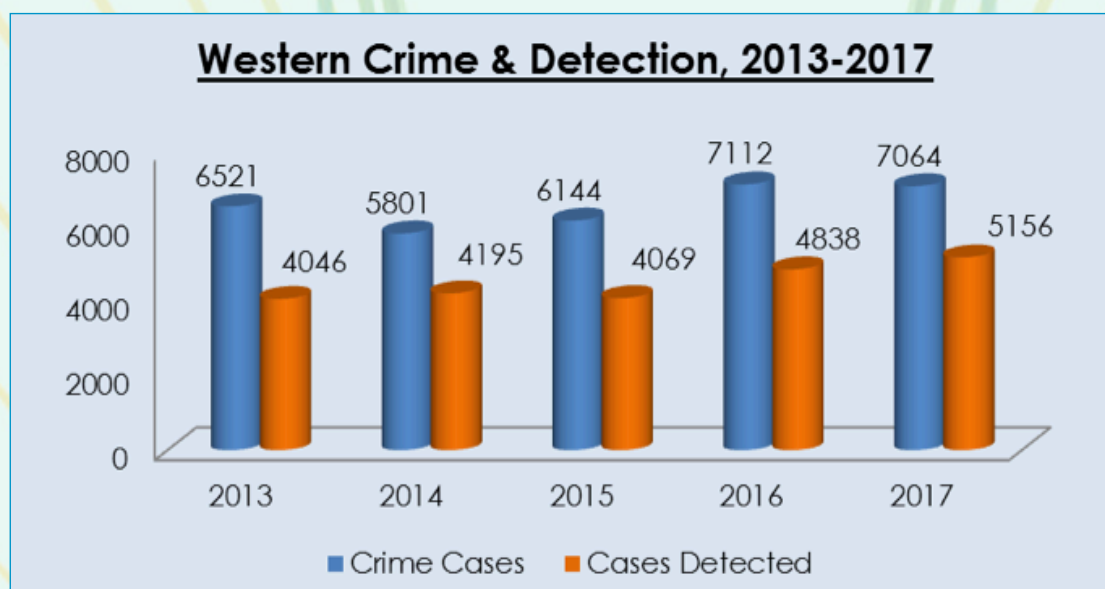

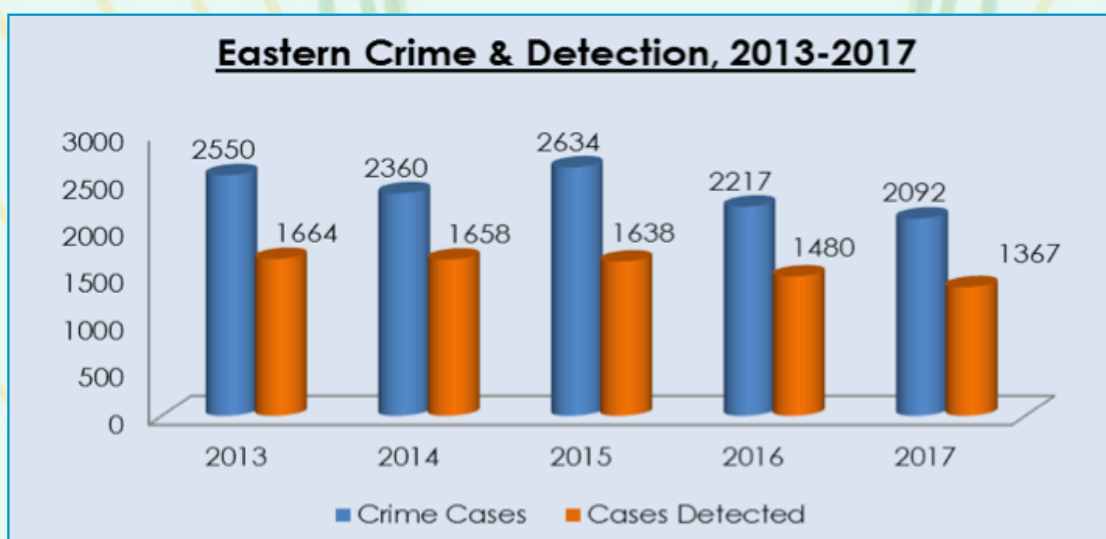

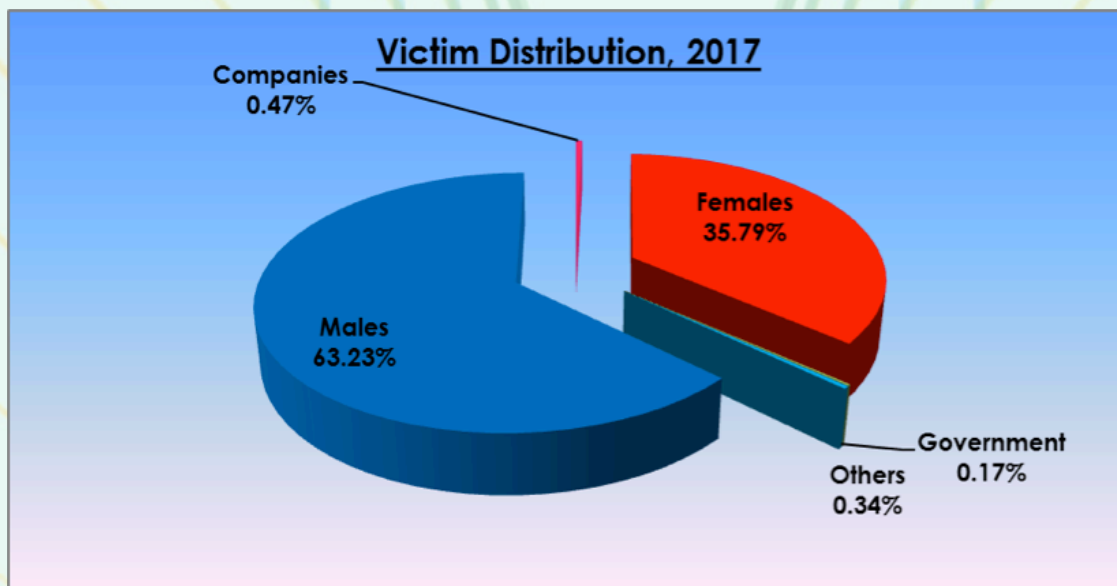
Victims

Offenders

Offender data refers to the number of offences detected through an action against an offender. As such, offender data does not equate to a unique offender count, nor does it equate to the number of offences solved. For example, an offender charged with Theft, Aggravated Robbery and Burglary would be counted three times.

Under Fiji Law, it shall be conclusively presumed that no child under the age of ten years can be guilty of any offence. Juvenile offenders are those below the ages of 18 years. Age refers to the offender's age during the time of his apprehension by police.

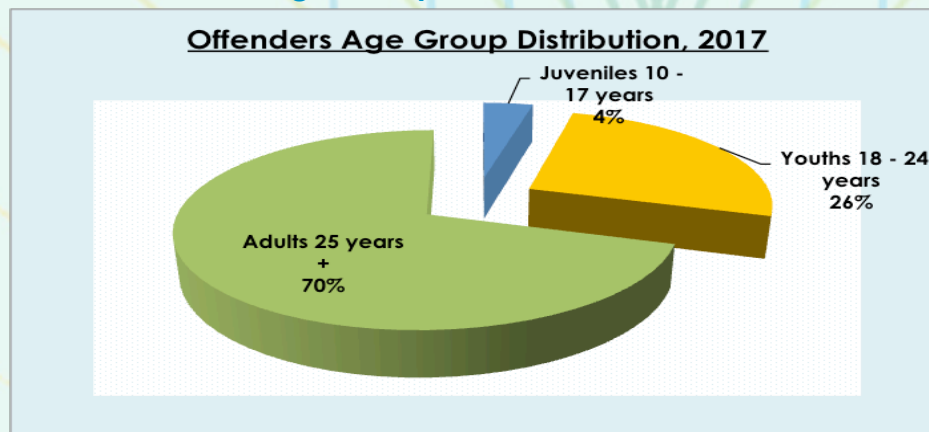

The drowning cases in Fiji have increased by 10% (3 cases) in 2017. The drowning victims are mostly from the 36 to 45 years category and Under 10 category. The drowning victims were mostly I-Taukei (55%), followed by Fijian of Indian Descent (36 %) and others (9%). From the gender category, there were 82% male victims and 18% female victims. The Western division recorded the highest in 2017 with 14 drowning cases followed by Southern with 7 cases, Northern with 7 cases and Eastern with 5 cases.
